**Chaska Officers issued 43 citations and 26 warnings during this reporting period.  
There were 270 calls for service**

**DWI:**

A vehicle was reported as possibly stolen from a home on Thomas Lane. An officer located the vehicle and male driver a short time later. The male driver was intoxicated and he failed field sobriety evaluations. His driver's license was cancelled. The stolen vehicle was deemed to be a civil matter, not criminal. The male was arrested and charged with DWI and driving after cancellation.



Officer Pesheck stopped a vehicle for speed and failure to dim headlights in the area of Bavaria Road and Adrian Drive. The male driver was intoxicated and was arrested for DWI.

**Disturbances:**



Two females, involved in an ongoing neighbor dispute, became involved in another verbal altercation at a residence on Crosstown Blvd. One female lunged at the other and attempted to assault her. Several other people restrained the female and prevented a fight. Police were called to the scene and the offending female was cited for disorderly conduct.

Police responded to a residence for a mental health situation involving a male. Upon arriving, officers observed the male inside the residence. The male was cutting his wrist with a knife and would not unlock the door to allow police inside. The officers continued to observe the male as they attempted to gain entry into the residence to prevent him from further harming himself. The male then began to stab his head with the knife as officers were able to gain entrance into the home. Using high-risk tactics, police were able to subdue the male and take him into custody. Paramedics tended to his wounds at the scene and transported him to a hospital for further treatment. Officers placed the man on a health and welfare hold.

A husband and wife were involved in an argument in their vehicle in the area of Hwy 212 and Audubon Road. They stopped the vehicle on the side of the road as the argument continued. The husband squeezed his wife's arm and attempted to drag her from the vehicle. Witnesses called the police, who arrived on scene and arrested the husband. He was charged with domestic assault.

Officers responded to a fight involving family members at their residence. A juvenile male was actively fighting with his mother and others, as police arrived. The male had slapped his mother's face and knocked her to the ground, during the altercation. He was arrested and charged with domestic assault, 5<sup>th</sup> degree assault and minor consumption of alcohol. He was placed in detox facility.

**Notable:**

**Pants On The Ground...**

At approximately 8:30 AM one morning, police received a complaint of a man with no pants on. The man was reported to be sitting on a picnic table, sans pants, and appeared intoxicated. Officers located the man inside his residence a short time later. He was still missing his pants, but was at least wearing underwear. He told police he had been outside waiting for a ride. Due to his condition, the man was placed on a health and welfare hold and transported to a hospital.
