DWI:

Police responded to a property damage crash involving two vehicles in the area of County Road 61 and Crosstown Blvd. A male driver of one of the vehicles was intoxicated. He failed field sobriety evaluations and was arrested for DWI. He was also charged with minor possession and minor consumption of alcohol.



Disturbances:

A three-car crash occurred on Clover Ridge Drive near Kerber Pass. One driver suffered non-life threatening injuries and was transported to a hospital. The male driver who caused the accident was charged with failure to yield right of way and improper change of course.

An officer responded to a loud noise complaint at a residence on Waters Edge Drive. The male resident had his stereo bass turned up during early morning hours, disturbing others living in the area. Police had to return to the home several times as the man continually turned the stereo up after they left. He then began shouting and yelling loudly so the complainants could hear him. He then refused to answer his door when police returned and gave "the finger" to officers through the window when they attempted to make contact with him. He was charged with unnecessary noise, disorderly conduct and offensive conduct toward a city officer. Management at the complex where he resides was advised of the incident.



Officer Lawrenz stopped a vehicle for traffic violations in the area of Hwy 41 and 2nd Street. The male driver had a revoked license. He was in possession of prescription drugs and baggies containing trace amounts of methamphetamine. He was arrested and charged with two counts of possessing a 5th degree controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and driving after revocation.
