Chaska Officers issued 44 citations and 33 warnings during this reporting period. There were 255 calls for service

Disturbances:

Officers responded to an unwanted male complaint at a city bar. The male had been attempting to eat and drink items at other customers' tables. Employees asked him to leave and the male became upset. He refused and finally left when the police were called. Police located the male in the area a short time later. He was intoxicated, belligerent and argumentative. He was placed in a detox facility.



An officer attempted to stop a vehicle for speeding on Hwy 41. The vehicle would not pull over and appeared to be trying to elude police. The vehicle finally stopped on Broadview Avenue. The male driver was taken into custody using high-risk tactics. The male stated he was on his way to his grandmother's birthday party and could not find a good place to pull over for the police. He was later released from police custody and cited for failure to yield to an emergency vehicle and speeding.

Police responded to a burglary alarm during early morning hours at the Chaska Community Center. The police response interrupted the burglary and officers did not locate any suspects in the area. Investigation continues.
