Summer memories often include lighting sparklers and watching fireworks during 4th of July celebrations, however, hundreds of children are injured by fireworks each summer.

Fireworks can cause serious burn and eye injuries. In 2010, 3,400 children under age 15 were injured by fireworks. Of these injuries, over 70% occurred in the weeks surrounding July 4th.

The safest choice is to leave fireworks to professional use.

- **Children** should never play with or light fireworks or sparklers.
- **Adults** who use fireworks should not use them around children.

Disturbances:

Officers responded to a disturbance call at a residence on Michelle Avenue. A mother reported her son was intoxicated and had left the home. Police located the son, who was with his older adult brother. He was intoxicated and was charged with minor consumption of alcohol. The older brother was also intoxicated and admitted to purchasing alcohol for his brother and allowing him to consume it at his residence. He was arrested for procuring alcohol for minors and violating the social host ordinance. Both brothers were placed in a detox facility.

A Chevy Silverado truck was reported stolen from the parking lot of Lenzen Chevrolet.

A burglary occurred at a residence in downtown Chaska. Items were stolen from the home. Investigation continues.

An adult male, who was intoxicated, assaulted his mother at their Crosstown Blvd residence. The male struck his mother's arm, knocking her down during the altercation. She called the police, who arrived and arrested the male for domestic assault and 5th degree assault.

Three males were acting suspicious behind an apartment complex on Crosstown Blvd. They fled into a wooded area upon the arrival of police, who located them a short time later. All had consumed alcohol and were under the age of 21. They were cited for minor consumption of alcohol. One male was additionally cited for possession of marijuana.

Buck Naked Bother...

Police received a complaint of an adult male exposing himself to at least four people from his residential garage on Lake Shore Drive. Witnesses told police the man was in his driveway and had, over the course of several hours, disrobed one item of clothing at a time until totally nude. This (of course) attracted the attention of the neighborhood, hence the request for police response. Officers located the man just inside his residence, as he was putting his clothes back on. The man stated he had been drinking in his garage all day. He said he was not sure what he was thinking and could not explain why he was naked in the driveway. Nor could the police. He did acknowledge that being "au natural" in public was wrong and agreed he may have a drinking problem. The man was cited for indecent exposure.
