Chaska Officers issued 72 citations and 24 warnings during this reporting period.
There were 307 calls for service

DWI:

A vehicle was stopped for speeding on Pioneer Trail. The male driver was intoxicated, failed field sobriety evaluations and was arrested. Several drug pipes and marijuana were found inside his vehicle. He was charged with DWI, possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.



Disturbances:

Officers responded to a domestic assault complaint at a residence on Jason Road. A husband and wife had been arguing. After the argument, the husband struck her head numerous times with an open hand. He then fled the residence prior to police arrival. Police eventually located the husband and arrested him. He was charged with domestic assault and 5th degree assault.

Approximately ten retaining wall blocks, which were large in size and weight, were placed in the middle of the roadway on Victoria Drive during nighttime hours. Substantial damage to a vehicle and possible injury to its occupants may well have occurred, if someone had driven into the blocks. They were removed from the road and the investigation continues.



Two males were attempting to provoke a fight with another male at an apartment complex on Crosstown Blvd. The two males were extremely intoxicated and uncooperative with police. Both were placed in a detox facility. One was charged with disorderly conduct.

A male threatened a group of people with a small baseball bat during an altercation at Lion's Park. Police responded to the park and the male refused to comply with their orders. He was arrested and charged with obstructing the legal process, 5th degree assault and possession of marijuana.

Police received a call of a suspicious male, walking in the area of Van Sloun Road and Maxwell Lane. Officers located the man and he was identified. He was in a drug-induced state and was experiencing hallucinations. He was transported to a hospital after being placed on a health and welfare hold.

Two females, who are under the age of 21, were consuming alcohol in a parked vehicle on Parallel Street. An officer spoke to the females and cited them for minor consumption of alcohol. One female told the officer her boyfriend and purchased the alcohol for them. The boyfriend was charged with procuring alcohol for minors.



Police responded to a welfare check for a male who was walking on Hwy 41 near the Minnesota River. Officers located the male underneath the bridge on the walking trail. The male had thrown his cell phone into the river and made suicidal statements referencing throwing himself in the river as well. He was placed on a welfare hold and transported to a hospital.

During nighttime hours one evening, police received a disturbance call on Waterford Lane. A resident called 9-1-1 to report his car alarm had been set off and a group of juveniles were leaving the area on foot toward a ravine. An officer walked on a trail into the ravine and heard the group approaching. The officer waited until the group was within approximately ten feet of his location. The officer then turned on his flashlight and announced himself as a police officer. Immediately, one male in the group quickly emptied the liquid contents from a large plastic cup onto the ground, threw the cup into the woods and acted as if nothing had occurred. Not surprisingly, the officer happened to notice the male throwing the cup. The male then stated he had thrown the cup into the woods because he no longer needed it. All seven juveniles in the group had consumed alcohol and were cited for minor consumption. One juvenile female was cited for violating the social host ordinance. The cup-throwing male was also charged with littering.
