**Chaska Officers issued 72 citations and 37 warnings during this reporting period.
There were 287 calls for service**

DWI:

A vehicle was stopped after an officer learned the female driver had several active arrest warrants. She was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. A breath test indicated a .227 BAC. She was arrested and charged with 2nd degree DWI.

Disturbances:

A vehicle was stopped for littering in the area of Wildwood Way. A male passenger was in possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia, for which he was cited. He was also charged with littering.



A DVD was stolen from the Chaska Library. It was later returned in a drop box with urine inside the DVD case.



Police responded to a disturbance at an apartment complex on Walnut Street, where a woman was screaming and possibly in distress. Officers arrived, heard the commotion, and located the apartment. Repeated knocks on the door went unanswered and officers made entry into the apartment. A female was present and stated she was alone. A short time later, a male was found hiding in a bedroom. He was not supposed to be in the apartment, as he had recently been trespassed from the building by the Chaska Police. The couple had consumed alcohol and had been arguing over a broken cell phone. The male was arrested and charged with trespassing and minor consumption of alcohol. The female was charged with procuring alcohol to a minor and violating the social host ordinance.

A man was waiting in a checkout line at a convenience store. A customer in front of him accidentally left a check card on the counter and left the store. The man used the check card to pay for his items. He then took the card with him when he left the store. The victim later reported the theft to police, who reviewed surveillance tape of the theft. The offender was identified and charged with financial transaction card fraud.

The warm weather has resulted in an increased number of theft from garages and theft from vehicle complaints. Residents in the Independence Ave, Manuela Dr, Nightingale Dr, Crosstown Blvd, Van Sloun Rd, Ashley Dr, and Park Ridge Dr have already experienced this criminal activity. Thieves, whether alone or in a group, tend to focus on specific neighborhoods or areas of town for their so called "Car Shopping" or "Garage Shopping" which is stealing from open garages and parked cars.

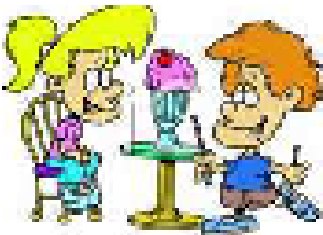
